
### **TOWNHOMES ON MEMORIAL DRIVE: AUGUST 2020 SURVEY RESULTS**

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

I think with a few changes, I could fully support this plan. With the townhomes adjacent to the park, a greater tie-in to the park is definitely needed, and more amenities in the park would be a selling point for the townhomes and value added to the community.

We don't need more apartments/ housing. Or storage places for that matter. Make a park or green space or outdoor venue- or more local shops with greenspace and trails.

While beautiful in concept, the pricing for the area as it now exists would need to be set low. How will you ensure safety for your residents? You are asking me to consider a move into an area that is highly trafficked and sometimes scary. (Try stopping in at the Shell station down the road at different times of the day or night, and you'll have some insight into my feelings as an older, but not retired, working professional.) And so, while pricing would be my first question (that's a good sign from a sales promotion standpoint), the real question is how safe, protected, and "at-home" I would feel in that area.

More thought/information needs to be given about the sewer, water, and traffic.

Our street is full of older couples. I fear this will cause more gentrification and they will be forced to move

My concerns include water runoff plans, traffic on Julian, the height of the homes- they would tower over the homes on Julian, they add nothing to our nhood, they will raise our property taxes but not add anything to our community, will they have an HOA? and these things have not, to my knowledge, been addressed.

While these particular homes are far from the worst offenders, they continue the trend of building pricey condos and townhomes all around unincorporated DeKalb. This pushes lower-income folks further into the periphery of the metro area. Also, promises to improve the park are nice, but nebulous.

This is about genderfication and money. If it was about the community you would be putting up affordable housing.


I am concerned about a development of all high priced homes, and the general lack of affordable housing in the Atlanta area.

How will our property taxes change. How will we protect our elderly neighbors who have like bed here for decades? Will they change school zoning? Who will live here because it is not afford housing? How will the neighbors on streets around the project be affected?

I think adding tennis courts, a pool, and perhaps a ball field would be improvements to the park that would be used by the townhouse owners as well as the surrounding community. It would help to build good will for this project as well.

Uniformed Trained security - that works both to reassure residents, as well as send the security message to the neighborhood. Perhaps even go with a video security system around the neighborhood, and posted signs about that fact.

Belvedere Park residents want improvements made to Shoal Creek Park I so if you are building in BP and making park improvements as part of the deal, make those improvements to Shoal Creek Park I, not Delano Line. It is wrong to buy and build in BP them ignore our community. You cannot just use us like that! Build a huge development in front of Julian homes, cause water runoff, cause extra traffic and noise, cause property tax increases and then improve another community's park to sweeten the deal???? Do not use us. It is wrong.

Any development project in the area that wants my full support needs to do two things. First, there must be space for lower-income individuals and families to continue to live here. And second, the project needs to address how it fits into a forward-looking plan for changes we will need to make around population density and energy utilization. We should be encouraging mixed-use developments, integration with public transit, and innovations in energy independence (solar panels) and efficiency (LEED rating).

I would hate to see the park turn into something manicured or over programmed. I like the woodsy, natural, wild feel of this area. That being said, I would love to see the vines clipped from the trees so that they don't get choked to death.

I am disappointed that this development seems to be simply to make a quick buck and not to actually improve the existing community.

Find something else better to do with the development money, like improving homes that already exist in the area instead of trying to push residents out of their neighborhoods. Stop gentrification!!

I do not think that Delano Line Park should be the focus of improvement. I think that Shoal Creek Park should be the focus of this improvement because it is within the bounds of Belvedere Park which is the neighborhood the town homes will be located in. Shoal Creek park is in need of major improvements — updated basketball courts, updated picnic tables, improved parking spaces, hazard reductions, park maintenance and more. Delano-Line Park is already well established, and funded. It is upsetting to me that the decision was made to benefit Delano-Line Park and not Shaol Creek which is located within Belvedere Park.
